Privacy Policy

How we respect privacy when we deal with personal information collected by our organisation

This Privacy Policy applies to information we (the Petersfield Area Community Trust) collect about individuals who interact with our organisation. It explains what personal information we collect and how we use it.

1. Personal data that we process

The following table explains the types of data we collect and the legal basis, under current data protection legislation, on which this data is processed.

Purpose	Data (key elements)	Basis
Enquiring about our organisation and its work	Name, email, message	Legitimate interests - it is necessary for us to read and store your message so that we can respond in the way that you would expect.
Subscribing to email updates about our work	Name, email	Consent - you have given your active consent.
Website functionality	Website activity collected through cookies	Legitimate interests - our website software stores a small amount of information, usually through cookies, to deliver behaviour that you would expect when navigating our website.

2. How we use your data

We will only use your data in a manner that is appropriate considering the basis on which that data was collected, as set out in the table at the top of this policy.

For example, we may use your personal information to:

- reply to enquiries you send to us;
- where you have specifically agreed to this, send you updates by email relating to our work or local news which we think may be of interest to you.

3. When we share your data

We will only pass your data to third parties if we are required by law to share your data. This is not a normal part of our activities.

4. How long we keep your data

We take the principles of data minimisation and removal seriously and have internal policies in place to ensure that we only ever ask for the minimum amount of data for the associated purpose and delete that data promptly once it is no longer required.

Where data is collected on the basis of consent, we will seek renewal of consent at least every three years.

5. Rights you have over your data

You have a range of rights over your data, which include the following:

- Where data processing is based on consent, you may revoke this consent at any time and we will make it as easy as possible for you to do this (for example by putting 'unsubscribe' links at the bottom of all our marketing emails).
- You have the right to ask for rectification and/or deletion of your information.
- You have the right of access to your information.
- You have the right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner if you feel your rights have been infringed.

6. Cookies & usage tracking

A cookie is a small file of letters and numbers that is downloaded on to your computer when

you visit a website. Cookies are used by many websites and can do a number of things, eg remembering your preferences, recording what you have put in your shopping basket, and counting the number of people looking at a website.

We do not collect any data from cookies and only use them minimally as required by the website software.

7. Modifications

We may modify this Privacy Policy from time to time and will publish the most current version on our website. If a modification meaningfully reduces your rights, we'll notify people whose personal data we hold and is affected.
